 - i. Issue with gas line but it is Xcel Energy line so RCS pays nothing for this issue
 - ii. Next meeting is next week, \$300,000 is needed before the start of stage 2
 - iii. By end of stage 1, turf will be down along with 1 layer of asphalt, turf will be in use by end of October, fencing to come next spring
 - iv. Reid Sollberger inquired as to balancing the need for a field with the need for increased teachers' salaries to which Mark Gobler responded the new field is necessary due to the deterioration of the existing field, adding that Howard Ludwigson and Chuck Larson looked into how to support higher teacher wages some years back but sustaining the level of annual revenue needed was not feasible; furthermore, the seven presidents in the Diocese discussed more flexibility with the salaries and will revisit this again in October
 - v. Reid Sollberger requested that marketing be done on how clubs and community can use the new track and field to which Mark Gobler replied that RCS has opened this up to the community including the City of Eau Claire, YMCA, etc; Mark Gobler went on to state that there are no bells and whistles, this is a small project for Rettler Corporation, it only has the bare necessities, and lastly, "It is a teaching station much like any classroom."
 - Kelly K. Mechelke stated that without proper facilities, RCS does not have students, if RCS does not have students, there will be no teachers to pay, adding the ease of a one-time donation for a field versus the difficulty of fundraising for the ability to keep salaries steady or increasing
