The Altoona Public Library is hosting a 40-minute holiday program at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, December 16<sup>th</sup>. Professor Emeritus Ivar Lunde, Jr. will share a Christmas story (<u>Surine Mugga</u>) that his mother read to him as a child growing up in Tønsberg, Norway. Mr. Lunde's oral retelling of the story is accompanied by a slide show set to music; a feast for the eyes and ears. The story has some perilous moments but ends on a happy note when Jesus Christ sends a messenger elf to help reunite a group of lost children with their parents. This program is recommended for families with children ages 5 and up.

Christmas Break this year will start Friday, December 22 with classes resuming on Wednesday, January 3rd.

Our School will be participating in the **Bloomer Jump Rope Contest** on January 27th. We will be holding a contest in the IC gym on January 12th to see what students (grades 1st-5th) will be competing based on the most jumps in 10 seconds. Mrs. Vallez will be introducing the jump rope unit to the students during PE classes. Students have to use a regulation rope for the contest which is a quarter inch hemp rope. She will be selling hemp jump ropes for \$2.00 during PE classes starting the week of **November 13th**. If your student would like to buy a jump rope to practice with at home they may bring \$2.00 on their scheduled PE day. It is not required to buy a jump rope. Jump ropes will be available to practice with in PE class during the unit.

### The 2024-25 enrollment season is quickly approaching!

Current Regis Catholic Schools families will be provided a two-week priority enrollment period in January to re-enroll for the coming school year. Current families will have the opportunity to enroll current students and siblings (new students) during this time.

Once this two-week priority enrollment period has closed, current RCS families are no longer guaranteed enrollment within the system.

Following the priority enrollment period for current families, enrollment for the next school year will open for families new to the Regis Catholic Schools system.

The enrollment fee for the 2024-25 school year will be \$150 for all families. (Paid once per family.) If not enrolled by May 31, our current families will pay a \$200 enrollment fee.

As a reminder, if you choose to enroll outside the two-week priority enrollment period for current families, you also risk losing your child(ren)'s spot.

We are enjoying reading about and discussing the lovely season of Advent. The Service Learning classes have made laminated bookmarks for the public library's Give a Kid a Book program. We're also noticing so much generosity with the library Blessing Basket. Merry Christmas!

### Guidance - Mrs. McElroy, School Counselor

This month students continue to focus on empathy. Kindergarten and 1st graders can identify feelings from someone's face, body, voice and/or situation. Second and third graders are learning that feelings are complicated; my feelings may be different from your feelings about the same situation, feelings can change quickly and we can have conflicting feelings. Fourth graders have been learning about taking another's perspective, how understanding our similarities and differences help us have empathy for each other.

Fifth graders have started the academic and career planning unit. This unit includes helping students discern interests and skills for future careers. In addition, students will explore ways to strengthen their executive functioning skills with an emphasis on growth mindset.

The week before Christmas, all students will have a mini lesson on mindfulness. The goal is to help students be aware; internally and externally. The holiday season can be an overwhelming time in ways both enjoyable and challenging. Let's help our kids (and ourselves) stay emotionally regulated.

Please note, that extended absences are not recommended. Assigned homework will be given to the student after he/she returns from vacation. Any missed assignments will be the responsibility of the student when he/she returns to class. Students will be required to complete missed assignments in a timely manner as required by their teacher/school. Teachers are not required to give work in advance to students to complete while on vacation. This causes extra stress for the teachers.

It is also the time of year when coughs, colds and other illnesses spread rapidly through the school. Please do not send your children to school when they are sick so they can participate in special activities. Please review the Illness Guidelines & Sick Child Policies as outlined in our handbook.

#### Illness Guidelines & Sick Child Policy

Iliness	Exclusion from School	Return to School
Fever Over 100.4 Degrees	When fever is at or over 100.4 degrees	24 hours after fever has subsided without prescription or non-prescription medication
Diarrhea/ Vomiting Illness of Unknown Origin	Diarrhea or vomiting	When symptoms are no longer present for 24 hours
Strep Throat	When sore throat, fever or rash are apparent or clinical diagnosis	24 hours after the first dose of antibiotics
Chicken Pox	When rash or fever are apparent or clinical diagnosis	7 days after the onset of the rash or until lesions have crusted
Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)	Red or pink eye with discharge or clinical diagnosis	24 hours afters the first dose of medication or when drainage is no longer present
Impetigo	Rash appearing to spread or clinical diagnosis	24 hours after the first dose or medication and clinical improvement
Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease	Fever or lesions present or clinical diagnosis	When fever is no longer present without medication and clinical improvement is observed
Influenza, RSV or Other Ciral Respiratory Infections	Fever, extreme lethargy	When fever is no longer present without medication and clinical improvement is observed
COVID-19	Onset of symptoms or clinical diagnosis	5 days after onset of symptoms (must either wear a mask for an additional 5 calendar days or test negative twice within 48 hours)
Head Lice	Lice or nits present	After shampoo treatment and head check do not show remaining lice or nits.
