THIRD GRADE THOUGHTS

For reading and social studies, 3rd graders have finished reading their biography of a historical figure. We will now begin the biography book project in class. Students will wear costumes to school on March 27th for our "Biography Breakfast" where they share important life events and facts.

First and third grade classes collected raffle basket items for our Lenten service project. From March 12-16th students may purchase raffle tickets for the items of their choice. The raffle drawing will take place after our 3rd grade Mass on Friday, March 16th. During the season of Lent we will be focusing on Catholic prayer, service, and alms giving. We will be reading Mrs. Mechelke's book <u>Love of Lent</u> and the <u>ABC's of Lent</u>, and writing acrostic poems about this season. Our virtues of the month are love and sacrifice. We are discussing ways we can joyfully sacrifice during the season of Lent. Third graders are preparing to lead Stations of the Cross on March 27th.

In science, we are prepping for the science fair on April 17th. Third graders will be learning about inventions, innovations, and influential inventors from the past. Each third grader will be in charge of researching a famous inventor, creating their own model of an invention or innovation, and writing a persuasive speech for the 3rd grade version of "Shark Tank". Students will present their projects at the 3-5 science fair as well.

FANTASTIC FOURTH GRADE

We are well in to the Season of Lent. Students did a wonderful job leading their Living Stations with reverence. I truly believe they grew in their faith from this experience. During the remainder of Lent, we will continue reading from the 4 Gospels about Jesus for our class Jesus Tree. We will also participate in many faith filled activities during Holy Week. One of them is making an **Easter Candle.** You may want to consider using it as part of your Easter Celebration. Remember Easter lasts for 50 days all the way through the Ascension of our Lord and Pentecost. Maybe you'll want to light it nightly for dinner or night prayers to help you family remember that the Season of Easter is the pinnacle of our faith!

In math, students are working on long division now. Knowing those multiplication and division facts helps tremendously with this skill. Thanks for your efforts at home.

In social studies, students are learning about the history of Wisconsin as a territory and about how it became a state.

In science, students are beginning to transfer their knowledge about force and motion to simple machines. Watch for information about the Science Fair. It will be held on Tuesday, April 17.

In reading and language arts the students cheered when I told them we would be beginning our literature study on <u>Charlie and the</u> <u>Chocolate Factory</u> after vacation. Students typically love this, especially when they get opportunities to win a Golden Ticket.

I pray you will all have a restful vacation and enjoy celebrating our faith with our children during the remainder of Lent, Holy Week, and into the Easter Season.

SECOND GRADE SCOOP

We are now in the 4th week of Lent, and our journey is half over.

The theme in our classroom this week is, "We are the Eyes of Christ." Our sense of sight allows us to bear witness to the wonders of the world. You can use your eyes to make positive changes in the World.

Our class is reading the story, <u>DEX</u>, <u>The Heart of a Hero.</u> We discussed who they thought of as a hero. SPANISH WITH MRS. LARABEE

A favorite song in February for Kindergarten was "My Mother is a Baker" in Spanish by Dr. Jean. They also enjoyed learning family vocabulary. First grade finished family vocabulary and focused on calendar vocabulary. In March the focus will be on animals for first-third grades. In the upper grades we diverted our attention mid-February to some sports vocabulary to match up with the Winter Olympics. A review of how to say the date, how to count the medals, and for fifth grade, some nations names and their flags in Spanish was a focus. At the end of the month second-fifth grades were learning or reviewing the Spanish alphabet. "The Alphabet Song" by Twin Sisters is currently being enjoyed. In March, fourth and fifth grades will work on various vocabulary review. After Spring Break fourth grade will start their Food and Restaurant Skit projects and fifth grade will start working on Spanish music videos. FIFTH GRADE FUN

During this season of Lent we have participated in the Stations of the Cross, worked on our Weekly Resolutions, participated in our Lenten project (Penny Wars), created our Lenten Crosses, and served our weekly Masses.

We are currently reading <u>Roll of Thunder</u>, <u>Hear My Cry</u> by Mildred Taylor. This is a story set in 1933, in Mississippi – during the Great Depression, when many people were very poor. Having land gives the Logan children an emotional foundation, as they begin to notice the difference between how black children and white children are treated in the South during the Great Depression.

Students have been completing their experiments and displays for the Science Fair coming up in April. Does temperature effect how we react to cutting an onion? What brand of gum can blow the biggest bubble? Join us at the Science Fair to find the answer to these questions and many more!
