

ACCREDITATION REPORT



AdvancED continues to highlight the outstanding progress and planning at Regis Catholic Schools.

We submitted a progress report in May 2016 and the AdvancED Accreditation Board responded with positive feedback.

Listed below are the commendations from AdvancED.

- 1. Regis Catholic Schools was commended for hiring a Pupil Services Director to assist students and faculty with special needs. Meeting the unique learning styles of diverse students has sufficiently improved with coordinating learning support services.
- 2. Regis Catholic Schools has implemented various programs to collect data to identify and monitor students' progress. The Curriculum Coordinator meets regularly with faculty to review the information and assess learning.

3. Regis Catholic Schools has trained faculty to analyze three years of standardized test scores with the assistance of the Curriculum Coordinator and Pupil Services Director. Continued staff development is ongoing to regularly review provided data and assess both strengths and weaknesses for improve student learning.

Regis Catholic Schools follows the criteria of high standards set by AdvanED. The norms for accreditation illustrate evidence and progress to improve student learning. Each year, a submission of reports is completed stating that we follow the accreditation standards. In three years, AdvancED will complete another audit of our practices. In support of our Core Values, we continue to follow best educational practices through accreditation.




