Lesson 21: “The World According to Humphry”

Each morning students begin with morning journal work, which includes 2-3 proofreading sentences. First, students make corrections independently in their journal. Then, we discuss the sentence corrections together, and students add in anything they may have missed. On Friday, two sentences are chosen from the week and students make the corrections independently, recalling the discussion from previously in the week.

Typical corrections include capitalization, punctuation, and spelling, as well as mistakes made with the weekly grammar concept.
