Patterns and Relationships

- Make comparisons using size, shape, color, and detail
- Copy, extend, describe, and create patterns

Spanish

- Introduction, repetition, understanding, or use of a few simple Spanish words such as colors, shapes, and body parts
- Learn numbers 1-15
- Listening skills
- Introduction to Hispanic culture with quick overviews of a few traditions.
- Learn numbers, colors, greetings and cordial responses
- Understand where, how, who, what questions
- Answer questions simply
- Learn some action verbs (third person)
- Learn the body parts
- Practice prayers in Spanish

Art

- Identify primary colors and understand how secondary colors are made
- Develop manipulative skills when drawing, painting, and construction of artwork using clay and art supplies
- Identify lines and shapes

Library

- Explain that libraries (school, public, other) are physical and digital places that provide a community of users with access to ideas, information, culture, and the pleasure of reading
- Locate the circulation area and explain its purpose
- Identify different sections of the library (e.g. Fiction, Non-Fiction, Reference, Biography, Easy/Everybody) as appropriate to the local organization
- Define and use grade-appropriate library terminology (e.g. library, librarian, early reader, picture book), and also book components (title, author, illustrator, publisher, spine, cover)
- Identify and read books with diverse voices, and various genres/formats, that complement our Catholic faith
- Abide by school's Acceptable Use Policy; apply Christian values when accessing the Internet and discuss how the Internet connects us globally

Technology

- Use and care for technology
- Practice digital citizenship rooted in faith
- Stay safe and responsible online
- Explore and create with technology
- Use technology for learning and problem solving

Music

Self-Awareness

 Recognize the feelings God has given them (such as happiness, sadness, anger, and fear), and express these emotions in ways that honor God and show love and respect to others

Self-Management

 Learn and practice calming strategies (deep breaths, counting, taking a break) to manage strong emotions

Listening Skills

 Demonstrate active listening—by looking at the speaker, keeping their bodies calm, and responding appropriately to directions or questions—as a way to show kindness, respect, and love to others, just as God calls us to listen with understanding hearts

Relationship Skills

 Practice taking turns, sharing materials, and using respectful words to solve small problems with peers
