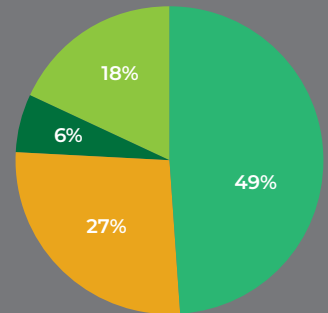

Your bequest could be a gift of specific assets (such as a vehicle, artwork or coin collection), a dollar amount (\$1,000, \$10,000 or \$50,000), or a percentage of your estate (3%, 10% or even 25%). A bequest could also be made from the residue of your estate or what is left after all gifts have been made to your heirs.

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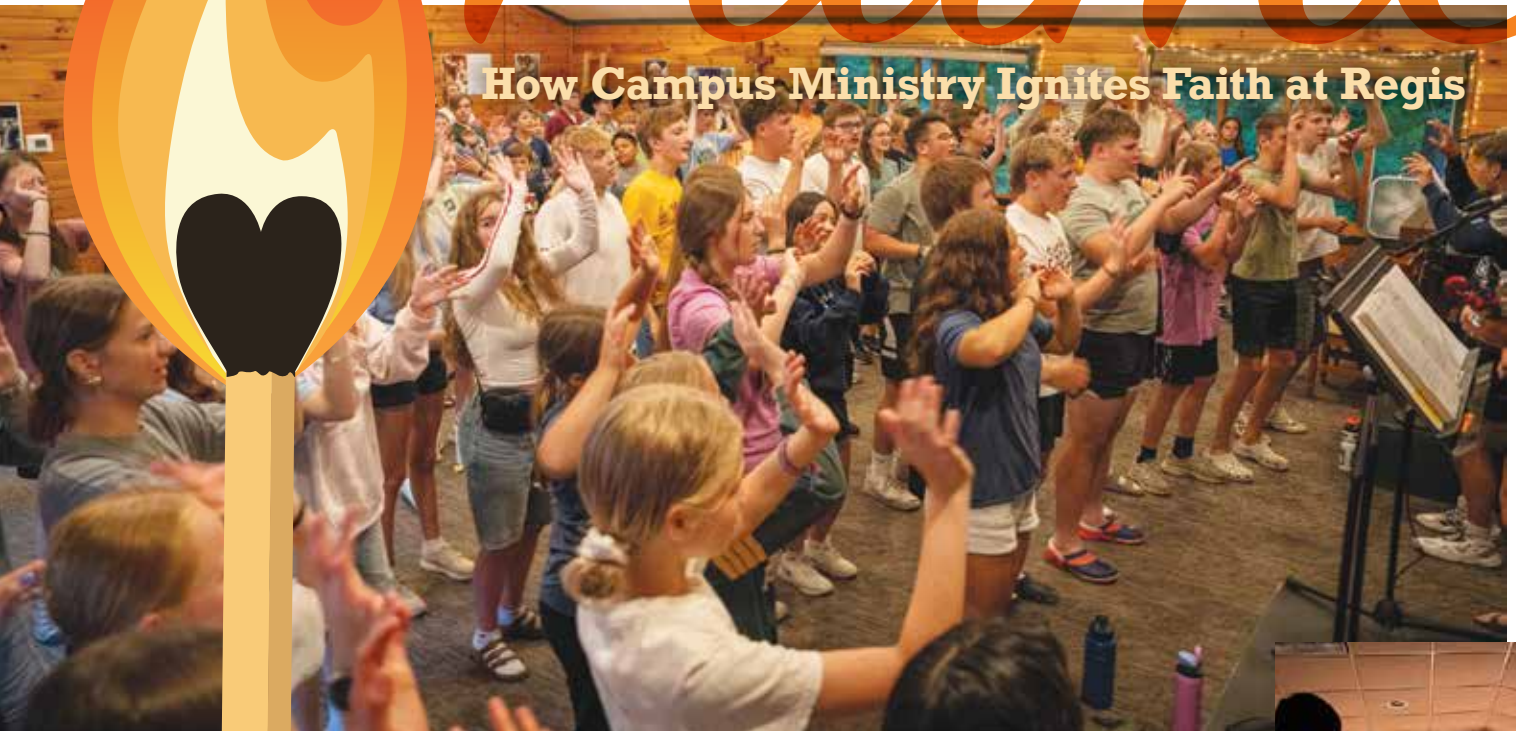

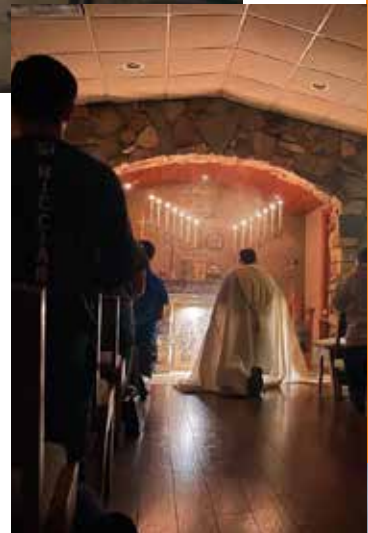
How Campus Ministry Ignites Faith at Regis



Recently, I was enjoying a cup of coffee and chatting with some women after a parish event. In the conversation, someone asked, **“So what’s been happening in Campus Ministry lately?”**

I smiled—because where to begin? God has been so good! As I shared about the retreats, small groups, and conversations with students, I could feel the fire of hope and the Holy Spirit stirring in my heart. Even more beautifully, that same flame began to shine in those around me. That moment reminded me that hope is not just an idea—it’s alive, contagious, and deeply rooted in the hearts of our young people. And in a world that can often feel dark, that fire of hope in God’s everlasting goodness should be shared with others.

At Regis, Campus Ministry focuses on two essential pillars: Encounter and Community. Fr. Levi Schmitt, Chaplain at Regis, explained, “Before you can have a fire, you first need a spark. Consistently, when kids participate in a camp, conference or retreat experience, they walk away with a sense that Jesus is real, He is alive, and He loves them. If this encounter is the spark, community is the kindling. The liturgical life of the school, *Serva Fidem*, bible studies and the other “routine” elements of campus ministry life serve to slowly build up the fire of that initial encounter into a blazing faith.” These two elements complement each other and together form the fullness of life in Christ.



Encounter

In the story of the Women at the Well (John 4:1-30), we hear about an encounter between Jesus and a Samaritan woman. When Jesus meets the woman with radical kindness, she at first is hesitant, but soon she begins to see the true identity of Jesus as the Messiah. This is the type of connection we want to provide to our students through events like Adventure Camp, Steubenville Youth Conference, SEEK, and Kairos retreats.

Adventure Camp & Steubenville Conference

This summer, 37 high schoolers traveled to Steubenville Joliet and, later in the summer, we spent a week at Crosswoods Adventure Camp with 40 middle and high school students. Both programs had a 50% increase in participants this past summer, a clear sign that something is stirring in the hearts of our young people! Jenille, a sophomore, shared, “I got to experience God’s love with my friends and worship with other people my age.” With God’s grace, we hope to welcome 60 students to Steubenville and 75 to Adventure Camp in the summer of 2026.

SEEK Conference

High school seniors are invited to attend SEEK, a five-day conference hosted by FOCUS, a college student outreach organization. This event equips them to continue growing in faith after graduation. One alumnus who attended last year, described it as “the pinnacle moment” of his faith journey. This January, eight seniors will travel to Columbus, Ohio, to encounter the Lord in a deeper way.

Kairos Retreat

For juniors and seniors, the Kairos retreat offers space to claim and deepen their personal relationship with Jesus. Elizabeth, a junior who will be attending the December retreat said, “I am excited for Kairos because it lets me take a break from all the day-to-day distraction and focus on my relationship with God.” We will host three Kairos retreats in the 2025–26 school year allowing over 30 students to experience this retreat.



Community

The second pillar of Campus Ministry is community. Community allows the seeds that were planted in their encounter with the Lord to be nourished and to bear great fruit. Within Campus Ministry this takes place in our middle school bible studies and Serva Fidem.

Middle School Bible Study

This semester, 75 middle schoolers—over 40% of our middle school students—are participating in a weekly Bible study. Sixth grader Rayna put it best: “It’s a chance to learn and focus more on God. We get to talk about Him, and it’s so much fun just to hang out.”

Serva Fidem Small Groups

Latin for “To Keep the Faith,” Serva Fidem pairs small groups of students with adult mentors who walk with them in their faith. Sal Martin, Serva Fidem Mentor, expressed, “They have grown in knowledge and love of their Catholic faith and for Christ. I have seen their desire to grow in faith, evangelization, and reverence.” Currently, six groups are meeting weekly, with plans to launch several more this semester.

Through all these experiences, one goal remains constant: to point students toward their Heavenly Father. We are blessed to have seven students currently in OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) classes to be welcomed into the Church this Easter! Veronica, a senior in OCIA, shared, “Campus Ministry is what led me to OCIA to become Catholic. The support from the staff and even peers in Campus Ministry gave me that push I needed to start OCIA. To this day, they let me know I’m not alone on this journey.” This is just one of the countless examples of how the Lord is working the lives of our students.

I often think back to that simple conversation over coffee, and I am again reminded how powerful shared hope can be. St. Paul writes, “Hope does not disappoint,” and we see that truth lived out every day at Regis. My prayer is that by sharing the ways God is working in the lives of our young people, your heart, too, may be set ablaze with that same fire of hope.

Volleyball

Season Overview

- The team finished with an overall record of 32-10.
- In conference play, the team went 4-3, which finished 4th in the Cloverbelt West.
- The team achieved a final ranking of #2 in D4 (Maxpreps), #4 in D4 (Wisconsin Volleyball Coaches Poll), and #33 overall in the state of WI (Maxpreps).
- The Ramblers finished with their second consecutive State Runner-Up title at the WIAA State tournament on November 8, 2025.

Key Players & Stat Leaders

- Olivia Morning (Junior, Outside Hitter): Led the team in kills per set with 3.5 K/S and led in total season kills (404).
- Lily Lewis (Senior, Middle Blocker): Led in hitting percentage (.338) and total blocks (61).
- Olivia Haselwander (Junior, Libero): Led in digs per set with 4.1 D/S.
- Ashlee Dykes (Senior, Opposite/DS): Led in serving aces (67).
- Izzy Reichert (Senior, Setter): Recorded 1,027 assists.
- All Conference Awards: 1st Team - Izzy Reichert, Lily Lewis; 2nd Team - Olivia Morning, Maya Ridenour

Playoff & Tournament Performance

The team made a strong playoff run:

- On October 23, Regis defeated the Abbotsford Falcons 3-0 in the WIAA D4 Regional Semifinal match.
- On October 25, Regis beat the Edgar Wildcats 3-1 in the WIAA D4 Regional Final match.
- On October 30, Regis defeated the McDonell Central Macks 3-1 in the WIAA D4 Sectional Semifinal match.
- On November 1, Regis beat the Clear Lake Warriors 3-0 in the WIAA D4 Sectional Final match.
- On November 6, Regis secured a win over the Montello Hilltoppers 3-0 in the WIAA D4 State Semifinal match.
- On November 8, Regis lost to the Heritage Christian Patriots 0-3 in the WIAA D4 State Championship.

Strengths & Highlights

- Depth of performance: With strong contributors in every major stat category, the Ramblers showed balance across our offense (kills, hitting percentage), defense (digs, blocks), and serving (aces).
- Momentum into playoffs: We entered the postseason with

multiple decisive wins, including straight-set victories, showing we were peaking at the right time.

- Senior leadership: The presence of our seniors Lily Lewis, Maya Ridenour, Izzy Reichert, Ashlee Dykes, and Bella Borton provided experience and stability for younger players.

Looking Ahead

Given our strong senior class and their playoff momentum, the Ramblers are well-positioned for next season but will need to rebuild in the off-season. We expect younger players to step into expanded roles, and if the team builds off this year's success, we hope to aim for continued deep postseason runs (potentially state-level) and a higher conference finish.





Cross Country

BOYS TEAM

Eleven boys raced this season and, for the second year in a row, finished in 3rd place at the Cloverbelt Conference meet and in 3rd place at WIAA Sectionals at Unity High School in Balsam Lake. The boys were consistently ranked in the top 16 in the weekly coaches' poll. Unfortunately, there were three other teams from our sectional ranked above us all season. They were able to beat one of those teams at the sectional meet, but the other two were too much to overcome with late-season injuries and illnesses affecting key runners. The two teams from our sectional placed 5th and 7th at the state meet - suffice it to say, the boys were a state-caliber team this year!

Senior captain Dominic Santine was the team's top runner all season, except in the conference and sectional races, where an illness kept him from performing at his peak. He medaled in many meets this season and earned Second-Team All-Conference honors, finishing 11th at the conference meet. Junior Benjamin Hoeft finished 8th overall at the sectional meet and earned a trip to the state meet in Wisconsin Rapids (where he finished in 53rd place). He also earned a Second-Team All-Conference honor, finishing 9th at the conference meet. Both Dominic and Benjamin broke the 17-minute barrier this year. Sophomore Mark Patchin also earned a Second-Team All-Conference honor, placing 13th at the conference meet. Junior Andrew Hoeft improved his time by over two minutes from the first meet of the year to the last. Freshman Layton Brooks also improved by over 2 minutes from the first meet to his PR at the Memorial meet. Junior Austin Bollman also had a solid season, improving steadily throughout. Sophomore Keelin Reid rounded out the regular top-7 with gutsy performances despite running the whole season on a broken foot. First-year runner, senior John Kohel, proved that it is never too late to start running. He joined the team three weeks into the season but still improved his time by nearly 2 minutes. Similarly, freshman Ethan

Straw also joined after the first two meets and was able to improve his time by over 4 and a half minutes! Junior Abram Gillet and Sophomore Riley Catt had solid seasons despite nagging injuries.

GIRLS TEAM

The girls team had eight runners this season and also finished in 3rd place at the Cloverbelt Conference meet and in 3rd place at the WIAA Sectional meet (one point ahead of Highway 12 rival, Fall Creek).

Senior captain Sylvia Spangler capped off a storied high school running career (3-time state runner) by steadily improving her time all season and peaking at the right time, earning a Second-Team All-Conference honor, finishing 12th at the conference meet. She was a First-Team All-Conference honoree, finishing 6th at the conference meet. She finished 3rd at the sectional meet, earning a spot at the state meet, where she finished 25th overall (just 3 seconds off a PR). This is the highest state finish in the 5K race for a female Regis runner in recent memory. Junior Kaylen Borst performed consistently solid all season long. She earned an All-Conference Honorable Mention, finishing 20th at the conference meet. Sophomore Claire Ernster improved her time by nearly a minute from last year. The team was rounded out by four other sophomores: Avalina Antonio, Evelyn Sykora, Emerson Moore, and first-year runner Ava Whiteside. Avalina and Evelyn battled injuries but were coming into form at the end of the season. Emerson was a steady runner who improved her time by a minute from the first race to the last. Newcomer Ava improved her time by over two minutes from her first cross country race to her PR at the Memorial meet.

The teams were led by co-head coaches Beth Borst, Justin Patchin, and Tim Santine. They were assisted by UW-Eau Claire senior runner Ryann Wagner, who was a wonderful addition to the coaching staff.

Highlights of the season included going on the road to beat Fall Creek in week 6, followed by a homecoming win vs. Mondovi. In the playoffs, Regis Football soundly beat Unity in level 1 and narrowly escaped a level 2 game vs Fall Creek. In level 3, the team fell to Mondovi 28-35 in a very hard-fought game. Overall, this was a very enjoyable team to be involved with. Through a lot of hard work, we became a tough team finishing with an 11-1 record.
