The 2022 Regis Baseball season was truly one for the ages, as the Ramblers capped off one of the greatest campaigns in program history by winning the WIAA Division 4 State Championship with a 12-3 win over Bangor in the title game at Fox Cities Stadium in Appleton on Thursday, June 16. The victory gave Regis its second WIAA baseball title in school history, with the other occurring back in 2002.

In concluding the 2022 season with a sterling 23 and 1 record, Regis set a single-season record for wins as well as team batting average with a robust mark of .390. Within those 23 wins, the Ramblers also won the Western Cloverbelt with a perfect 12 and 0 record. The only other time Regis went undefeated in conference play was 1989 when they won the CWCC with a 6 and 0 ledger.

This year's road to Appleton was not easy. Incredibly, within the Ramblers' last five playoff games, the team had to rally to win each contest. On three occasions within that stretch, the Ramblers were down by as many as three runs. Specifically, their playoff run unfolded as follows:

Regional Semi-Final, May 31 | Regis 12, McDonell 3

Regional Final, June 1 | Regis 9, Immanuel Lutheran 3 (Regis trailed 2-1 going into the bottom of the 5th inning.)

Sectional Semi-Final, June 7 | Regis 7, Independence-Gilmanton 5 (Regis trailed 3-0 going into the bottom of the 3rd inning.)

Sectional Final, June 7 | Regis 13, Northwoods-Solon Springs 10 (Regis trailed 6-3 going into the top of the 5th inning.)

State Semi-Final, June 15 | Regis 14, Oakdale 4 (Regis trailed 4-1 going into the bottom of the 6th inning before exploding for 11 runs to end the game by the 10-run rule.)

State Final, June 16 | Regis 12, Bangor 3 (Regis trailed 3-2 going into the bottom of the 3rd inning.)

During the two state games at Appleton, Regis set an all division record for total steals with 20, including a single-game all divisions state record for stolen bases with 15 vs. Bangor in the title game. Moreover, Regis set a Division 4 record for most runs in an inning with 11 vs. Oakfield in the bottom of the 6th, and Ramblers' senior outfielder Alex Leis also set a single-game D4 record for triples, lacing two vs. Oakfield.

This year's trip to Appleton was the second consecutive year Regis had made the trek to state for the WIAA classic and its fourth overall. Regis' first trip to state for WIAA baseball happened in 2002, when the team beat DeSoto 4-1 to capture the Division 3 State Championship. In 2007, the Ramblers lost 8-7 in eight innings to former CWCC rival La Crosse Aquinas. Fourteen years later in 2021, Regis got knocked off by Coleman 6-4 in the Division 3 semi-final. Going farther back in Regis Baseball history, the Rambler Nine made appearances in the WISAA State Tournament in 1952, 1972, 1973, 1994, 1995, and 1999.

Congratulations to our 2022 WIAA state champion Regis Ramblers Baseball team! They will rightfully - and forever - be remembered as one the greatest baseball teams Regis has ever had.

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Track & Field


The Regis Boys and Girls Track & Field teams both worked hard by coming to practice every day this season, even when they were tired and sore. Our student-athletes had success this year by taking care of their bodies off the track by taking ice baths, stretching, hydrating, eating right, and being on time. All of these good habits helped lead the teams to great accomplishments!

During the Western Cloverbelt Conference Championship meet, our boys placed 2nd overall as a team and had six conference champs while the girls placed 6th overall and also had six conference champs. During regionals at Durand, the girls earned the title of regional champions, winning by three points, advancing six regional champions to sectionals. The boys earned 2nd place overall, advancing eight regional champions to sectionals. At sectionals in Colfax, the girls placed 4th overall, advancing four studentathletes to state and the boys placed 5th overall, advancing four studentathletes to state.

We are so proud of our student-athletes for a great showing at the 2022 WIAA State Track & Field Championships! Carson Tait became a state champion in the 100-meter dash with a photo finish and a winning time of 11.30! Carson also placed 7th in the 200-meter dash with a time of 23.06. He also is a new school record holder for both races! (The 100-meter dash record was held for 28 years by Brian Walter and the 200-meter dash record was held by his teammate Gus Theisen. Carson makes history by being the fastest sprinter to come through the Regis Track & Field program!)

The 4x100 meter relay team of Ian Andrews, Carson Tait, Alex Figy, and Gus Theisen also became state champions with a winning time of 43.27, breaking the school record which stood for seven years.

Gus Theisen placed 5th in the 100-meter dash, Carly Borst placed 8th in the 400-meter dash, Ashley Chilson placed 10th in the 800-meter run, and the 4x800 meter relay team of Carly Borst, Ava Moore, Eydie Myers, and Ashley Chilson ran the best of the season and placed 8th.





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Girls Soccer

The Regis-McDonell Girls Soccer team finished a successful season with a 12-2 conference record, placing 2nd in conference, and with a 15-7 overall record. The team developed into an excellent passing and possession team as the season progressed. The team received the #4 seeding in its region and lost a 4-3 heartbreaker in the final five seconds of the

game to #1 seed Washburn/Bayfield. The team had two first team All-Conference selections in sophomores Annabelle Schroeder and Colleen Callaghan. Senior Alison Haag earned Honorable Mention. Annabelle Schroeder led the team in scoring with 24 goals and 17 assists and was selected as the team's Most Valuable Player.




