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
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#### Report from the Dean

#### "Oh, what a year the last few weeks have been!"

I found myself thinking these words often during these past three months. Indeed, my brain gets foggy even trying to remember my world as it existed before the pandemic. The past feels so distant, and so much has changed.

One thing, at least, has stayed the same – the amazing personal commitment of our Regis leaders, faculty, and staff to make the Regis experience a great one for our students and families. I am so proud of the work they did the last three months – going far above and beyond any credit they will ever receive.

I was blown away by the leadership of our principals. Crunched for time, amidst high anxiety and stress on all sides, and with very limited resources, they scrambled again and again. They did it every time a new change or new need arose. I could see in their eyes the amazing love they have for our students and their families, and above all else their love for our Lord Jesus Christ. Somehow they still found time to keep me up to date on the latest developments, even though I didn't expect it. Almost always, I found that all I could do was say, "Keep up the amazing work!"

I had many conversations with teachers, some of whom went far outside of their comfort zone to teach in methods they had never before attempted. I had many conversations with parents, many of whom found ways to work full time while homeschooling their children. Many families began praying together in ways they never knew before. We discovered along the way some wonderful innovations in the area

of distance learning. We also discovered

something that most of us knew all along

- there is no substitute for being together in person and growing together as disciples of Jesus and members of the Regis family.

I felt the stresses of our Central Office staff, trying to solve insoluble problems and figure out how to work through complex situations never before faced. They persevered and kept finding ways to support our people.

I was especially moved by the ongoing prayer services, Bible studies, and faith conversations held online by Fr. Sedlacek and other members of his campus ministry team. Many of our students continued to be fed spiritually throughout this time.

I felt blessed to be one of the few who were personally present for two of the live stream ceremonies – the 5th Grade Promotion at St. Mary's Elementary School and the Baccalaureate Mass for Regis High School. During the fall and winter months, how could I ever have dreamed that we would be celebrating these Masses without any of the students present? Thanks to John Cook's technological magic and dozens of hours of preparation from our principals, staff, and chaplain, the events brought tears of gratitude to many eyes. These students will never forget the day. Thank you.

Times like these test our character. I think most of us have experienced ugly moments in which our grief and anguish and fear brought out not-so-great thoughts or words or actions. I know that I have had those moments! I am guessing that you have as well.

Then enters God's grace, an invitation to something deeper and better, if we are willing to surrender, to obey, and to follow where Jesus leads. I saw many of our students, faculty, staff, parents, and priests heed that invitation from the Lord and become better human beings through these trials. I am proud of our Regis family and grateful for the ways God has strengthened us amidst these hardships.

I will conclude with the inspired words of St. Peter in Sacred Scripture: In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:6-7).



Riley Michaud has lived in six states and owns her own business.

ichaud is a member of Eau Claire Regis' graduating class of 2020. She was born in Colorado Springs, Colo., lived in Missouri for seven years, relocated to the Chicago area for a short stint, moved to Shreveport, La., and returned to Missouri where she completed middle school and her first two years of high school.

The family relocated to the Chippewa Valley two years ago when Riley's father, Matt, retired after 24 years in the Air Force. Many might see moving so often during one's formative years as a detriment; Riley sees it as character-building.

"With every new adventure has come a new learning opportunity," she said. "In reality, I would not be who I am without those experiences."

Having visited her grandparents in Chippewa Falls over the years, Riley said Wisconsin "has always felt like home." That sentiment was reinforced when she became a Rambler. She'll now be a member of Eau Claire Regis' 61-student class that's graduating Wednesday and Thursday.

"I was welcomed with open arms right away," she said.
"It's been a positive atmosphere ever since."

#### Impressive Images

Riley has been interested in photography for at least 12 years, as evidenced by a family photo of her with her very first camera at the age of 7. She's since established her own business, Riley Pictures Life Photography. Portraits dominate the venture's website, but Riley's work diversified while serving as Regis' first student photographer.

"The images she captures truly are of professional quality, and I was grateful to partner with her," said Meghan Kulig, the school's communications director. "Riley would capture images at various school and athletic events across the Regis system, providing me with the photos for use on our social media channels and in marketing materials.

"She would even visit our elementary schools if her schedule allowed to capture images there."



**Atop Riley Pictures** Life Photography's Facebook page is the message, "There is always something to smile about." The phrase aligns with what Riley said is her life mantra. The goal is to "every day wake up with a positive attitude. perform at least

one good act and have a moment of insane courage," said Michaud, who adapted the approach from the messaging at a Christian camp she attended.

That positive outlook — which also earned her the nickname "Smiley Riley" for some - has helped her succeed even at a time of uncertainty due to a pandemic.

"I see a lot of positivity coming out of this — neighbors helping each other, hospitals uniting, schools recognizing students who may not have gotten recognized otherwise," she said. "Every Friday night football game or eating out with family won't be taken for granted anymore."

#### Future Blue Devil

Michaud considered — and was accepted at — UW-Stout, Johnson & Wales in Rhode Island, College of Charleston in South Carolina and Concordia University in Mequon. She opted for the Menomonie university in part for its strength in an area in which she plans to pursue her bachelor's degree – hotel, restaurant and tourism management.

"I want to be out there doing something I love," said Riley, who added that the welcoming community of the Air Force was an early influence."We had many meetings and slept in many hotels," she said. "It was humbling to see

these people drop everything and welcome you. I want to be that welcoming face for people coming to town, to make their day a little better."

Michaud was involved in a ministry team that volunteered at Regis and St. Mary's Elementary School. She forged friendships through those experiences and as a Pep Club member.

Despite her youth, "mature" is a word others often use to describe Michaud.

"I'm grateful Riley has made Regis her home these past few years," said Paul Pedersen, Eau Claire Regis principal. "She's an inspiration to all of us and maybe the most grown up and mature young lady I've known."

Added Kulig: "I can honestly say I have never worked with another high school student who is as mature as Riley is. There is something truly special about her."

Given social distancing concerns, Riley won't graduate alongside her classmates. But, thanks to her glass-half-full approach to life, she's grateful her parents, grandparents, aunt and younger sister, Molly, will be in the room Wednesday as she begins the next chapter of her life.

"I wouldn't want it any other way; the one consistent thing has been my family," Riley said in regard to the many schools she's attended. "They're my graduating class."




