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
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Catholic Schools Week

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Mr. Paul Pedersen began serving as Principal of Regis Middle and High School on July 1, 2014. Meghan Kulig sat down with him to see how his first year has been going so far!

Q: What has it been like to take on this new role?

A: It's been wonderful. Some days, it is a touch breathtaking to be in charge of a building where your parents went to school, where you went to school and where your children are getting their education, especially considering our time-honored

especially considering our time-honored tradition of excellence, both academically and athletically. It is certainly an honor and a privilege to be in this position right now. But, at the same rate, it is very humbling to know that I actually get to report to a place every day that I consider to be the greatest place to work. I'm surrounded by an outstanding faculty and we have wonderful, supportive families and alumni.

Q: What changes, if any, are you working on?

A: When you work in education, you are going to be part of a process of change and that's normal and healthy. The initial thing that was important for me in this transition was to make sure there was a sense of stability known and felt by the faculty, the students and the parents. The things that work at Regis Middle and High School should remain in place. Those that need attention should be looked at. The dress code is always a hot topic. We are addressing student dress code issues with the new student dress code committee.

We are also working to maintain the integrity of the learning environment. We want our students to know it is their right to sit down in a classroom environment and to feel their academic progress is not impeded by another student or negative behaviors.

Finally, we are taking a look at balancing the appropriate use of technology inside our building. Instead of fighting technology, we are working with students on how to manage and utilize technology in the most appropriate way.

Q: What is your favorite part of each day?

A: Right away in the morning, when I stand on the front step or at the front door and greet students as they arrive. It is my greatest privilege and joy to greet kids as they come in and welcome them to a new day. I also love going to Mass with the student body and participating in the Liturgy.

Q: What makes you proud of your students?

A: The students define this institution. The students and their hard work, their co-curricular activities or athletics, and the things they do as service to our community define Regis. Regis has a time-honored tradition of excellence, but that excellence is actually what is practiced every day. The time-honored tradition is now.

Report from the classrooms

Regis Catholic Schools was recently accredited through AdvancEd. The AdvancED accreditation process helps us stay student-focused for continuous improvement with student achievement.

We have formed committees to ensure we have the resources and support needed to enrich students' classroom experience. Our teachers work hard to make connections from the classroom to real-life through performance-based lessons and active discussions. AdvancEd helps us focus our attention on the eyes of our learners and how they view each day. The accreditation process is a blessing because it also looks at our Catholic identity and how well it is infused into all our subjects and students' lives.

As a smaller school system, it is ever challenging to offer all that is needed for today's students. We have begun using Odysseyware. This is a web-based educational option that is ideal for core curriculum, blended learning, alternative education, and more. Odysseyware is offered beginning with third grade and continues beyond high school. There are more than 90 core content classes offered and 55 courses in career and technical education. Currently, Regis High School is using Odysseyware with more than 24 students.

The use of these course offerings will not replace or be a substitute for teachers and the courses they teach. It is an outstanding way to explore other curricular areas that are affordable and beneficial.

AimsWeb is an in-house computer program that allows us to measure each student's academic level and use progress monitoring for their individual growth more efficiently and effectively. We use this computer program in Math and Language Arts.

Maintaining a culture supporting continuous improvement requires on-going self-reflection mixed with encouraging motivation and active engagement for all.

Regis Catholic Schools recently announced the debt the system had owed to the Diocese of La Crosse has been paid off.

The "We Belong to Christ Capital Campaign", the "Building Our Future Campaign" and recent estate gifts were instrumental in this debt retirement, along with strategic financial planning and annual payments made by Regis Catholic Schools.

History indicates the loan was necessary at a vulnerable time for Regis Catholic Schools and was used to meet financial obligations when our Catholic school system consolidated in the late 1990s.

As we move forward, Regis Catholic Schools will continue to ensure our financial stability while maintaining the high-standards of our mission.

"I would like to personally thank the numerous benefactors and supporters who were able to donate, allowing us to focus on keeping an excellent, faith-based academic system intact through those years," said Regis Catholic Schools President Mark Gobler. "Now that the debt to the Diocese of La Crosse is no longer part of the finances, Regis Catholic Schools will continue to examine a number of other areas that would be beneficial to all of our constituents."

Regis Catholic Schools is committed to working to continue increasing enrollment, securing current and future revenue sources and using those potential enhancements carefully in order to maintain the high quality of instruction we provide to our students.

We are happy to announce that Regis Catholic Schools has retained the services of Pam Foegen as Pupil Services Director.


As we move forward, Mrs. Foegen will help the staff and principals at our elementary, middle and high schools in a variety of ways.

He currently plays music gigs on Friday and Saturday nights.

But soon, a Regis High School senior will find himself at the biggest gig of his life - Berklee College of Music in Boston, Massachusetts.

18-year-old Sean Jordan will be attending the prestigious school in the fall of 2015. Berklee calls itself the 'world's premiere learning lab for the music of today—and tomorrow' and according to statistics, only 35% of students who apply get in.

The talented musician plays multiple instruments – piano, saxophone, drums, bass, ukulele and the banjo – but, the guitar is his primary instrument. Jordan started playing the guitar professionally at the age of 12 and continues doing so 5 to 6 times a month. He says he decided to apply to Berklee after his performance at Volume One's 'Sounds Like Summer Concert Series' in Eau Claire's Phoenix Park.

"That was my first time performing all original music by myself and it was a blast," Jordan said. "That was a turning point for me musically and I decided that I would like to pursue it beyond high school, if possible."

Jordan started the application process in September and had his audition in Chicago in late-November. Regis band director Jeff Walk says Jordan is one of the most talented and goal-driven music students he's ever had the pleasure to teach.

"Whenever a challenge is presented to him, he always goes far beyond and above what is to be expected. Sean has people skills that cannot be taught. He is tenacious and sticks to a task to see it to a successful outcome," Walk said. "Sean has developed into an individual leader that everyone in our expanding high school band looks up to and relies on his vision and decision making skills. I wish him the very best!"

"We're really proud," added Jordan's mother. "Sean has worked so hard. He's been playing the guitar since he was little; thousands of hours, every single day of his life."

Jordan says he's excited to pursue his passion for music, adding "the fact that music gets to play as big of a role in my life as it does is truly a blessing." He says his ultimate goal is to be successful enough in music that he can do it for a living. "Whatever that takes, that's what I want to do," he said with a smile.






Wrestling

In just its second season, the Regis Wrestling team won six duals, defeating five schools it lost to in its inaugural season. Basketball has been part of his life since he was young. Now, Regis High School senior Billy Wampler is being recognized for his talent and getting ready to take his game to the next level.

On November 12, 2014, the Regis High School senior signed his National Letter of Intent to play Division 1 basketball at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa. He says he had 18 different Division 1 scholarship offers during the recruiting process.

"When I started getting offers, I got some good advice to make a list of what was important to me both athletically and academically," Wampler said. "My basketball focus was about being able to contribute early in my college career, making a difference in the program and having a coaching staff and teammates that I can trust. Academically, I was looking for a great business program and Drake certainly has that and more."

Then, in January 2015, Wampler was nominated for the 2015 McDonald's All American Games. The only other Regis basketball player to be nominated for the same honor was Jeff Uelmen in 1997.

Coach Bill Uelmen says Wampler is one of the most talented and physically gifted players he's ever coached. "Billy deserves the credit for putting in the time to make himself one of the top players in the state. He is a special player that doesn't come around too often in a coacing career. Drake is getting a legitimate college basketball talent."


